31st Annual ESU 8 Academic Quiz Bowls

Beautiful weather greeted twenty-three Senior High Quiz Bowl teams who competed in the Neligh offices of ESU 8 on March 3. Last year, flooded highways forced this event to be cancelled after just an hour.

Approximately two hundred students from these 23 teams were quizzed about a very wide range of topics: Language Arts, Science, Mathematics, Social Studies and Current Events. The doubleelimination tournament included 44 head-to-head matches, held in four competition rooms. Chambers won third place, Norfolk Senior High was the Runner-Up, and Lutheran High Northeast was the Champion!

Lutheran High Northeast and Norfolk Senior High met in one of the first rounds of the day. Norfolk Senior High lost the match and was sent to the losers' bracket. After that loss, however, they defeated their next seven opponents and met up with the undefeated Lutheran High Northeast team again in the Championship match! The score was tied, leading up to the twelfth and final toss-up question. A Lutheran High Northeast player buzzed in first and answered correctly to win, 40-35. **NOTE: The 2020 State Quiz Bowl, that Lutheran High Northeast and Norfolk Senior High were to compete in, has been cancelled.**

The Middle School/Junior High Quiz Bowl was held the following day, on March 4. Twenty-Five teams of 6-8 grade students came from throughout the seven county ESU 8 region. Stuart won third place, Norfolk Junior High was the Runner-up, and Pierce was the Champion!

Pierce was beaten by Neligh-Oakdale in the first round of the day. Pierce then won the next seven matches to qualify and face the Norfolk Junior High team that had won all five of their matches. Pierce won that match, 45-40, to force a tie-breaker match to end the tournament. Norfolk Junior High surged to a 50-point lead before Pierce caught up. Pierce tied the score on the last toss-up question. Then they answered their bonus question correctly to win, 65-55!

D W Eyes

This kit is designed to graphically demonstrate to students how much drinking affects a person's perceptions.

As soon as you put on the goggles, you will see that objects blur, lines bend, and simple tasks become difficult. Wearing the goggles while trying to perform tasks such as throwing a ball, walking a line, or steering an imaginary car will demonstrate the difficulty and danger of acting "under the influence."

In addition to the one set of D W Eyes Goggles, there are two extra goggles that can be checked out (KT1109). This kit also contains:

- 1. VHS D.W. *Eyes* .. The DWEyes program is a fantastic way to reach students about the dangers of drinking and driving. This engaging introduction to the material will set the stage for your own classroom discussions and activities.
- 2. DVD *Crossing Deadly Lanes* (20 min.) ... Real DUI offenders, judges, lawyers, medical personnel and victims share their stories about the hard realities of alcohol-related automotive fatalities and the prison sentences that sometimes follows.
- 3. DVD Drinking & Driving Kills (20 min.)
- 4. DVD Dying High 2: Real Stories of Drugged Driving (24 min.)
