High School

The competition was limited to twenty teams and began with "pool play" where four teams, on a blind draw, were assigned to one of five rooms. The four teams in each room were matched against each other, guaranteeing three matches for every



team. The 1st and 2nd place teams from each room moved on. That tenteam list seeded the single-elimination bracket.

Summerland was the 3rd place winner, 2nd place went to Norfolk High School, and our Senior High Quiz Bowl Champion is Lutheran High Northeast! Lutheran High Northeast and Norfolk High School will represent ESU 8 at the Nebraska State Academic Quiz Bowl in Hastings on April 27, 2022.

ESU 8 Mental Health Program



ESU 8 will be managing the Comprehensive School-

Based Mental Health Program being offered through the Nebraska Department of Education. The goal is to develop and maintain a Comprehensive School-

Based Mental Health Program to be supported by the Nebraska Department of Education with a three-year grant. This program will provide support to all school districts in Nebraska, so school districts can better support the mental health needs of students and school staff.

The Comprehensive School-Based Mental Health Program has the following requirements:

- Attend the Mental Health Institute hosted by ESU 8
- Conduct a needs assessment (universal screener)
- Develop and implement an action plan
- Partake in technical assistance calls/meetings
 - Participate in the SHAPE Assessment (data collection)
- Report on process through a final success sharing report and presentation
- Share data and success stories for others in the cohort
- A team of 3-7 school personnel to include an administrator, a counselor, a school psychologist, a Licensed Mental Health Practitioner (if applicable), a school nurse, a teacher, a parent, and a student

Each school personnel who attends the three-day Mental Health Institute will be provided a \$150 stipend. Also, each school personnel who attends all the monthly Technical Assistance Meetings will be provided a \$150 stipend. Districts will be able to choose **two** of the following to help sustain and create their teams:

- 1. The purchase of a universal screen for students Limited to \$5 per student that will be screened. Please check with your school psychologist or mental health practitioner for assistance.
- 2. Telehealth Equipment up to \$2,000
- 3. The purchase of evidenced based curriculum, for example Second Step up to \$10,000
- 4. Reimbursement <u>OR</u> Additional time with an ESU 8 Mental Health Provider (must already be established with an ESU 8 Mental Health Practitioner) Up to \$30,000
- 5. Tier 2 Interventions Small group interventions Up to \$10,000
- 6. The development of calm corners Up to \$6,000
